

### What We Do

#### **WOMEN'S ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT (WEE)**

Equipping women with skills, market access, and resilience.

- 538 women engaged in entrepreneurship initiatives.
- 1,072 people are experiencing lasting change.
- Current projects: Promoting Women's Economic Empowerment (PWEE) Project and Bougainville Cocoa Farming Families Support Program (BECOMES).

#### **WOMEN'S VOICE**

Empowering women and girls to participate in decision-making and advocate for their rights.

- 600 health professionals reached (47% women) with gender interventions.
- Current Project: Sapotim Lida Project (SLP).

#### **RESILIENCE**

Responding to emergencies like floods, landslides and tribal conflicts.

 119,452 people reached (52% women and girls) with humanitarian assistance in FY23.

## SEXUAL REPRODUCTIVE AND MATERNAL HEALTH RIGHTS (SRMHR)

Improving awareness on rights to quality family planning and healthcare services.

- **1500 women and girls** reached with awareness on SRMHR and healthcare rights.
- **3500 people** are experiencing lasting change.
- Current Projects: Improving Social Accountability for Better Health Outcomes (IMPACT).
